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GRAPHIC PUBLICATION FORMAT

The Academic Times Journal's graphic publications for the Tertiary Graphic (Tertiary G) are summarized into a page for research articles, undergraduate project work, two pages for a master's thesis, and a PhD dissertation. Research from tertiary lecturers, seasoned researchers, corporate bodies, and individuals can take up to three leaflets in the graphic publication. However, the full research paper will be published in The Academic Times Journal.

FORMATTING STYLE

2.1) FORMATTING GUIDELINES

- ✓ Document Format: Microsoft Word (.docx) or PDF.
- ✓ Font: Times New Roman, 12pt.
- ✓ Line Spacing: 1.5 lines.
- \checkmark Margins: 1 inch on all sides.
- ✓ Alignment: Justified text.
- ✓ Headings: Clear hierarchy (e.g., H1, H2, H3).
- ✓ Figures and Tables: Numbered sequentially, with captions below (figures) or above (tables).

2.2) VISUAL ELEMENTS

- ✓ Use high-resolution images (300 dpi minimum).
- \checkmark Ensure charts and graphs are labeled and easy to read.
- ✓ Avoid cluttered visuals.
